The Intermediate Maths Challenge is a 25 question multiple choice test that aims to stretch and stimulate the very best young mathematicians in the country. The awards are Gold (top 6%), Silver (next 14%), and Bronze (next 20%). The top 5% or so of the entrants are invited to sit the next round called the Kangaroo, where they can achieve various grades.

Here at Chosen Hill, a number of students from year 11 partook in the challenge and Alicia McCreath achieved an excellent Gold award and then went on to take part in the Kangaroo. She received her certificates from the Head-teacher.

Gloucestershire's CCard Scheme

Chosen Hill School are participating in the CCard Scheme. To enable students to get a CCard, they will need an initial meeting with Ms Rose (lr@chosen-hill.gloucs.sch.uk), and will be able to distribute condoms once they have the CCard.



The CCard:-

Allows young people to talk about relationships and sexual health in a safe non-judgemental space with a trained adult. The discussions need to be timely and help build confidence when it comes to condom use and wider sexual health conversations.

Allows access to free condoms and information in a way that suits them. The CCard may also be a way to find other services.

Helps young people and are more likely to use a service when they feel they are not being stigmatised against, they trust the professional their information is confidential.

Is a confidential scheme for young people (unless we have concerns young person is being harmed).

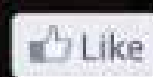
