Career Mapping Workshops

This 7-hour course covers:

- Online skills assessments which match personal traits and interests with different jobs and sectors
- Career mapping activities to help plan the next steps in your career towards a chosen career goal
- Support with completing applications for jobs or further education and training courses
- Support with preparing for interviews
- CV refresh to ensure participants stand the best chance of accomplishing that next step in life

Classic 'You Could Be...' programme

This short course usually delivered one day a week throughout Term 6 covers:

- Weekly employability skills training
- Weekly personal social development sessions
- The L1 Award in the importance of resilience and grit qualification
- The L1 Award in Works Skills qualification
